# Field Trip to Canada Without Leaving the Classroom 

## Temperatures

1. Take turns saying the poem out loud until you memorize it:
$o$ is Cold
10 is not
20 is warm
30 is hot!
2. Teach yourself this trick for converting Celsius temperatures to their approximate temperature in Fahrenheit. You can practice around town when you see a bank sign displaying temperatures. You will only be a few degrees off.

## To convert Celsius to Fahrenheit:

Double the Celsius temperature, then add 30.
Example: $17 \times 2=34$
$34+30=64$
17 Celcius $=64$ Fahrenheit
3. Convert this: 22 Celsius converts to $\qquad$ Fahrenheit.
4. If someone said to you, "It must be really cold in Canada because the temperature is only 20 ", what would you reply?
