

Field Trip to Canada Without Leaving the Classroom

Language Lesson 2: French

1. Look at the map Percentage of Canadians who speak French at home to answer the following questions.

- Which provinces/territories have less than 10% people who speak French only?
- Which provinces/territories have a large percentage of French-only speakers?
- Is Canada a primarily French-speaking or English-speaking country?

2. Look at the map Percentage of Canadians who are French-English bilingual to answer the following question.

- Which provinces/territories have between 8%-12% of French/English bilingual speakers?

3. Now, compare both maps.

- Which province has almost the same percentage of people who speak French at home as who are bilingual French/English speakers?
- Which province has more people who speak French only at home, than people who are bilingual speakers of French and English?

4. Scan the worksheet called “Nommez l’animal” (Translation: Name the Animal). Underline words that look like English words. Fill in blanks around the picture on the worksheet with the correct words in French. Refer to glossary.
