ABOUT OUR PROGRAMS

- Affordable, fully accredited graduate social work education that provides students with a well-integrated academic and practical education through classroom-based MSW and BSW offerings in Orono and Belfast, Maine, and an online-hybrid MSW program.
- Field practicums may be completed at qualifying organizations geographically convenient to students.
- Students in the online-hybrid program enjoy courses taught by the same faculty who teach in the other MSW formats offered by our flagship university. Using state-of-the art learning management systems, students engage in most classes without the need to be online at a particular time.
- The University of Maine School of Social Work prepares proficient and ethical professionals committed to social change in a variety of organizations, specializations and roles.

UPON GRADUATION/CAREERS

- Graduates serve as social work clinicians, program planners, administrators and community change agents in a range of public and private settings and systems.
- UMaine's MSW program prepares students to qualify for social work licensure at the LMSW level (Licensed Master Social Worker) upon graduation.

- Graduates who complete specific clinical social work courses and appropriate supervised clinical work are eligible to apply for licensure at the LCSW (Licensed Clinical Social Worker) level.
- International organizations such as the World Health Organization (WHO), United Nations and its International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF), and the International Committee of the Red Cross employ MSW graduates.
