2017 marks the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary of Confederation. As usual, the 24<sup>th</sup> Biennial conference of the Association for Canadian Studies in the United States (ACSUS) will welcome papers and panel proposals from graduate students and academics on any aspect of the Canadian experience. But we especially encourage papers that take stock of some aspect of the country's development since 1867, and we will join with others around the world in making Canada's Sesquicentennial journey the central theme of our meeting.
