

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K-16 TEACHER TRAINING ACTIVITIES AND OUTCOMES: 92ND ANNUAL NATIONAL COUNCIL FOR THE SOCIAL STUDIES (NCSS), NOVEMBER 14-18, 2012

Northeast National Resource Center on Canada K-12 Canadian Studies Education Outreach Coordinator **Betsy Arntzen**, worked in consort with the two other Canadian Studies outreach coordinators to increase the Canadian content at the NCSS.

Built on the success of a four-year emphasis to showcase Canadian studies at the NCSS annual conference beginning with *Canada is Coming to NCSS!* initiative (2008), and the follow-up success of providing Canadian content at the 2009, 2010, and 2011 conferences.

In 2012, the three NRCs on CANADA outreach educators **Tina Storer**, **Amy Sotherden** and **Betsy Arntzen**, collaborated with <u>Nadine Fabbi</u> (associate director of the Canadian Studies Center, University of Washington), with two exemplary Canadian educators <u>Mike Clare</u>, <u>Steven Marcotte</u>, with Western Michigan University's Canadian Studies faculty <u>Ruth</u> <u>Writer</u>, and with other Canadian educators from British Columbia and Alberta.

- This resulted in the NRCs on CANADA coordinating and presenting a total of 26 hours of Canadian content presentations over five days. In addition, they were key participants in 3 receptions plus managed the NRCs on CANADA exhibit table.
- Directly impacted 578 educators attending the sessions, plus 2000 more at the exhibit table and receptions.
