General Chemistry Spring 2018

From Syllabus and FAQs (below):

What are the policies about attendance and completion of lab assignments?

- 1. If more than 2 lab assignments are missed, for any reason, even if you have excused absences, you will receive an F in the course. For example, if a general chemistry lab course has 11 assignments during the semester, you must complete 9 or more of the assignments to pass the lab course.
- 2. Completion of assignments that require a lab report means timely submission of the lab report. Lab assignments more than two weeks late, in general, will not be scored and will be counted as a missed assignment.
- 3. If you have difficulties submitting lab work, it is your responsibility to get help and work out a solution with your TA. With the possible exception of the final assignment, lab work is never accepted past the end of classes.
- 4. There is limited access to make-up labs. To the extent offered, students will have the ability to make-up and complete an assignment that otherwise would result in a missed assignment. There is no guarantee that any lab can be made-up and the shorter time limits for submission of lab work (e.g. lab report) can be imposed on a make-up lab (see Making Up a Lab posted on the ICN Resources page).

If I decide to drop lecture (CHY 121, CHY 122, CHY 131) what happens to my lab?

- 1. For the CHY 123 and CHY 133 lab courses, if you withdraw from the co-requisite lecture course (CHY 121/131), you must drop the lab. Note: this is a change from fall 2017. There are no exceptions anticipated to this rule for spring 2018.
- 2. For the CHY 124 lab course, if you withdraw from the co-requisite lecture course (CHY 122), then you may stay in lab if your lab scores are above 70%, you inform your TA, and you contact the general chemistry coordinator, Mitchell Bruce, to verify your ICN scoring average.
