- Selecting a Domain Name
 Anybody have? WhoIs search
 Trademark search? Perhaps
- Reclaiming a Domain Name
 - Live with it?
 - U.S. Anticybersquatting Act?

 Best shot is strong trademark or famous person
 - Uniform Domain Name Dispute Resolution Policy (ICANN)

Uniform Domain Name Dispute Resolution Policy (ICANN)

- Administrative process.
- Trademark owner must show:
 - trademark is same or confusingly similar to registered second level domain name;
 - party has no legitimate right or interest in domain name, and
 - domain name was registered and used in bad faith.

- use is in connection with bona fide offering of goods or services prior to notice of dispute;
- owner has been commonly known by the domain name; **or**
- owner making legitimate noncommercial or fair use of the domain name, without intent of (i) commercial gain, (ii) misleadingly diverting consumers, or (iii) tarnishing trademark at issue
- If challenger proves case, admin panel cancels or transfers domain name

- Protecting a domain name
 - acquire a trademark?
- Obtaining multiple domain names generic (.com, .org, .net, .info), sponsored for specific industries, generic restricted for specific purposes, & infrastructure ... 1000+

3. Trademark Concerns

- Discussing trademarks of others typically legal but use of logo may draw inappropriate infringement claim
- Link to a party through their logo same issues
- Selecting a trademark consider strength and market value
- Protecting federal registration

• False statement damaging to reputation of someone or organization

Elements:

- published to third parties (text or oral)
- knew or should have known statement was false
- Defenses: 1st Amendment, truth, etc.
- Potential liability for service providers

5. Linking and Framing Concerns

- linking results in no copying
- **Derivative Work** still a derivative work through contributory © infringement
 - link another's art/photo to appear on your website
 - link to pass off another's work as one's
- **Defamation** link to defaming statement e.g. this imbecile killed my dog

Linking and Framing Concerns (cont'd)

- **Trademark Infringement** linking leads public led to believe TM owner is affiliated with or approved/sponsors the page
- Framing splits screen into multiple sections; may be used to inappropriately show content from another site without direct copying
- still contributory © infringement
