

Early College Outdoor Leadership Program

Two opportunities: July 21-Aug. 2, 2024 (Tanglewood) Aug. 5-14, 2024 (Greenland Point)

Learn foundational knowledge and skills to deal with medical and traumatic emergencies in remote settings, and gain introductory knowledge in outdoor and adventure activities, while completing two college courses.



KPE 207: Wilderness First Aid (1 cr.)

- Topics include patient assessment, wound and infection care, environmental emergencies, spinal cord management and moving patients, anaphylaxis and other medical emergencies, and CPR/AED
- Successful completion of this course carries a nationally recognized Wilderness First Aid (WFA) certification

KPE 265: Outdoor and Adventure Activities (3 cr.)

- Canoeing: paddling techniques, and environmental and equipment considerations for day and overnight trips
- Bouldering and Climbing: fundamental skills and safety knowledge needed for indoor bouldering and top-rope climbing
- Hiking and Orienteering: essential map and compass skills
- Challenge course: educational concepts behind facilitating and processing adventure-based activities

Cost

- Tuition-free for Maine public school and homeschool students.
- Reduced tuition for out-of-state and Maine private school students of \$145 per credit.
- Overnight fees: \$900.00, including all housing, meals, and certification fees. Scholarships available.
