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Logo

1.1 PRIMARY LOGO

To the right is the primary logo for Maine EPSCoR. When you are able to use full color, this is the logo you should use.

1.2 LOGO COLOR ALTERNATIVES

To the right are the logo color alternatives for Maine EPSCoR. When you are unable to use full color, these options are available to use. Do not use any other color variations other than what is listed to the right.

1.3 DOWNLOAD LOGO

To download the Maine EPSCoR logo to use on your materials visit, umaine.edu/epscor/resources.



DARK BLUE

To use when a single Pantone color is allowed. See page (6) for a list of colors.



WHITE

To use on a dark background. The entire logo should be white with the lighthouse windows being knocked out.



BLACK

To use on a light background when the product is printed in black and white.



GREY

To use on a light background when the product is printed in black and white.

1.4 LOGO SPACING

To the right on the top is the spacing to use around the Maine EPSCoR logo. Using the “M” in MAINE, use this as a guideline to keep the spacing around the logo.

1.5 LOGO SIZE

To the right on the bottom is the minimum size when using the Maine EPSCoR logo. The logo should not be smaller than .5” high.

1.6 LOGO ERRORS

To the right are examples of what not to do when using the Maine EPSCoR logo. A list of approved logos are on pages 2 and 3.



OLD LOGO

Do not use the old logo.



LOGO ON LIGHT BACKGROUND

Do not use the white logo on a background that is too light. Use the full color, black, or grey logo in this instance.



LOGO ON DARK BACKGROUND

Do not use the logo on a background that is too dark. Use the white logo in this instance.



WRONG COLORS

Do not change the colors of the logo. Approved logos can be found on pages 2 and 3.

Colors

2.1 LOGO COLORS

To the right are the primary logo colors for Maine EPSCoR. These colors should be the primary colors used on all Maine EPSCoR materials for brand constancy. For a list of acceptable alternatives for logo colors, see page 3.

EPSCoR stands for the Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research. It is a federal program directed at states that have historically received smaller portions of federal research and development funding. EPSCoR develops partnerships between their higher education institutions, industry, government, and others to effect lasting improvements in research capacity, innovation, and economic development. Maine EPSCoR at the University of Maine: EPSCoR is an acronym for the National Science Foundation's Experimental Program to Stimulate Competitive Research, and Maine EPSCoR received a \$20 million, 5-year grant to advance Maine's research capacity and promote innovation while providing benefits to society.
