Thank you for forwarding all motions and resolutions passed by the Senate on April 27, 2011. I have indicated disposition of these actions below:

- 1. Motion to Approve Amendments to the University of Maine Faculty Senate Constitution. Approved.
- 2. Resolution in Support of the Recommendations of the Writing Consultants Regarding the University of Maine Writing Program and a Renewed Effort on Behalf of Writing across the Curriculum. I will convey the Senate's support to President Ferguson as Provost Hunter, Dean Hecker and he consider the university's ability to implement all or some of these recommendations.
- 3. Resolution to Adopt Updated General Education Student Learning Outcomes for Human Values and Social Contexts: Western Cultural Tradition. Thank you for informing me of the new student learning outcomes in this area. I understand that the determination of these student outcomes falls within the purview of the Senate and requires no action on my part.
- 4. Resolution to Support Faculty Representation on the Information Security Policy Governance Council. The Information Security Policy Governance Council is a University of Maine System group. I will forward a copy of this resolution to Chancellor Pattenaude.
- 5. Motion for the Selection of Faculty Representation to the Information Security Policy Governance Council. As long as the University of Maine System requests that the University of Maine President appoint one or more members to the System's Information Security Policy Governance Council, I agree that at least one of those appointments will be a faculty member, chosen from among several faculty members suggested by the Faculty Senate.

- 6. Motion for Establishing Faculty Oversight of the Information Security Policy at the University of Maine via the Senate. As UMS policy, the Information Security Policy cannot be altered by the University of Maine. However, UMaine will undoubtedly develop campus implementation procedures and monitor the impact of the policy. I agree that the Faculty Senate, through the appropriate committee, should work with University administrators in developing implementation procedures and monitoring the policy's impact on campus.
- 7. Motion to Clarify the Scope of Information Covered by the System Information Security Policy. I interpret this motion as seeking a change, or at least a clarification, of terms used in the UMS policy. I will, therefore, send this motion to Chancellor Pattenaude and suggest that he respond.
- 8. Motion in Support of a System-wide Institutional Repository. I accept this motion and ask Provost Hunter and Dean Rumery to proceed as requested.
- 9. Motion on Faculty Senate Support of a Reorganization to Create a School of Computing and Information Science. I accept this motion and urge Provost Hunter to continue with the remaining steps necessary to create a School of Computing and Information Science within the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences.
