The **Food Science and Human Nutrition (FSN)** program at the University of Maine has a Bachelor’s degree with three concentrations that lead to diverse careers.

- The [Food Science](#) concentration focuses on food product development, food safety, sensory evaluation, and food analysis with jobs in high demand in the food industry.
- The concentration in [Human Nutrition and Dietetics](#) (also known as the Didactic Program in Nutrition and Dietetics – DPD) is for those who want to pursue a broad range of careers in the nutrition and health field, and leads to credentialing as a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist or Dietary Technician..
- The [Food Management](#) concentration provides a unique combination of food and business courses that can lead to employment in restaurants, hospitals, school foodservice departments, and with companies that produce foods, food ingredients, or processing equipment.
