Max Abrahms is a professor of public policy and political science at Northeastern University, where he specializes in security studies, particularly the study of terrorism. Abrahms has published extensively in leading academic and popular outlets such as *International Organization*, *International Security*, *International Studies Quarterly*, *Security Studies*, *Comparative Political Studies*, *Harvard Business Review*, *Foreign Affairs*, *Foreign Policy*, *New York Times*, *Washington Post*, *USA Today*, and *Los Angeles Times*. His book, *Rules for Rebels: The Science of Victory in Militant History*, explains why some groups such as the Taliban achieve their political demands whereas other groups such as the Islamic State have failed. Abrahms regularly fields questions about the terrorism landscape in the news and for government agencies.
