Students who matriculated in Fall 2017 or after must complete a minimum of 60 credits outside of the academic major. **At least 18 credits must be earned from the History Department at the University of Maine. For purposes of this requirement, institutional credit is defined as all University of Maine (Orono) courses regardless of delivery method (face-to-face, online, ITV, etc.).**
