Students who matriculated in Fall 2017 or after must complete a minimum of 60 credits outside of the academic major. **At least 18 credits must be earned from the History Department at the University of Maine. For purposes of this requirement, the residency credit is defined as all courses offered by the University of Maine (Orono) or its regional campus, the University of Maine at Machias, regardless of delivery method.**
