English language proficiency is considered sufficient at a minimum of Test of English as a Second Language (TOEFL) of 530 (paper) or 71 (internet) or International English Language Testing System (IELTS) 6.0 composite score. The proficiency requirements do not apply to students enrolling at the Intensive English Institute at UMaine.
