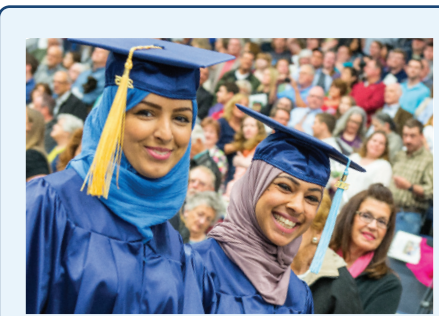


Undergraduate Students
