APPOINTMENT TO THE GRADUATE FACULTY

Division of Music - Criteria for Appointment to the Graduate School, UMaine

Newly hired tenure-track faculty in the Division of Music will be granted an initial appointment as full graduate faculty to run for 5 years or through the tenure decision, whichever is longer. Each new faculty member will submit a CV to the Graduate School, and a signed ROQ from the Graduate Coordinator will also be submitted on behalf of the new faculty member.

For each successive 5-year review period, the faculty member will show documentation of at least one activity from the categories of Creativity described below.

Full Graduate Faculty shall:

- have a full-time tenured or tenure-track appointment at the University of Maine
- possess an earned doctorate
- demonstrate activity in one or more of the following categories of Creativity:
 - (a) Success in performance (live or recorded), composition, or music scholarship.
 - (b) Adjudication in state, regional and/or national music festivals, other outside professional evaluations, reviews, letters, awards.
 - (c) Research and publication.

Associate Graduate Faculty shall:

- have a full-time tenured or tenure-track appointment at the University of Maine
- possess an earned Master's degree or Artist Diploma
- demonstrate activity in one or more of the following categories of Creativity:
 - (a) Success in performance (live or recorded), composition, or music scholarship.
 - (b) Adjudication in state, regional and/or national music festivals, other outside professional evaluations, reviews, letters, awards.
 - (c) Research and publication.

External Graduate Faculty (musicians who do not hold appointments at the University of Maine) shall:

- possess an earned doctorate
- demonstrate activity in one or more of the following categories of Creativity:
 - (a) Success in performance (live or recorded), composition, or music scholarship.
 - (b) Adjudication in state, regional and/or national music festivals, other outside professional evaluations, reviews, letters, awards.
 - (c) Research and publication.

Graduate instructors shall:

- have a part-time appointment at the University of Maine
- possess an earned Master's degree or Artist Diploma
- demonstrate activity in one or more of the following categories of Creativity:
 - (a) Success in performance (live or recorded), composition, or music scholarship.
 - (b) Adjudication in state, regional and/or national music festivals, other outside professional evaluations, reviews, letters, awards.
 - (c) Research and publication.
