Beyond Birds and Bees: Sexuality and Relationship Education for People with Autism and Developmental Disabilities

Session Description: This workshop will present the history as well as the current state of sexuality and relationship education for people with autism and developmental disabilities; evidence-based strategies for including sexuality education in special education curricula and IEPs; present resources currently available for teaching sexual health education; and present strategies to use when facing barriers.
