Kirsten Dorsey, OTR/L is the National Program Director for *A Matter of Balance:* Managing Concerns about **Falls Lay Leader model**, which is a program developed by MaineHealth's Partnership for Healthy Aging. Designed to reduce the fear of falling and increase activity levels among older adults, *A Matter of Balance* is designated by the Administration for Community Living (ACL) as a top-tier, evidence-based Falls Prevention program. Kirsten started with *A Matter of Balance* (MOB) in March of 2020 and her first project was creating, piloting, and distributing the virtual translation of the MOB program.

Kirsten is an Occupational Therapist and has worked with many older adults after a fall. She is very excited to now be focusing on preventing falls and loves to share the practical things that we can all do to prevent falls and stay upright!
