




Background

- Clean Water Act and Maine's NRPA require permits for activities in protected resources
- Mitigation protocol:
 - 1. Avoid
 - 2. Minimize
 - 3. Compensate











Maine's ILF Program

- Statewide program launched in 2007 w/ DEP as sponsor & TNC contracted as administrator
 - In-lieu fees assessed by DEP/Corps deposited in regional funds administered by TNC
- Funds are awarded through a competitive process to projects that compensate loss
