Clean Water Act


- Federal Water PollutionControl Act of 1948
- Clean Water Act of 1977
 - Made it unlawful to discharge any pollutant from a point source into navigable waters, unless a permit is obtained.





What is an MS4?

- Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System
- Storm Water Management System
 - Road Ditches
 - Culverts
 - Catch Basins
 - Curbs and Gutters
- Owned or Operated by the City
- Discharge Directly to Surface
- Waters, or Wetlands






MDEP MS4 Program

 - July 1, 2013 to June 30, 2018

School Education Events in Brewer




- 24 year adopt-a-school program

- On April 28, 2017 Brewer was honored to host 12 veterans from Project Healing Waters Fly Fishing.
- The veterans installed markers on 100 catch basins and passed out 250 Brewer Stormwater Program door hangers to residents.

- On June 15, 2017 Brewer High ROTC students stenciled 135 catch basins and passed out 300 informational door hangers.

Penobscot River Keepers teach students about the history, beauty and recreational uses of the river

Typically, 6-8 groups of local high school and middle school students tour the Brewer Water Pollution Control Facility and participate in a lunch and learn session to learn about stormwater pollution prevention, wastewater treatment, and jobs in the water industry.

Felts Brook Water Quality Testing



ver 48 Environmental Science Students

- Water quality testing the last 5 years
- Benthic monitoring in 2015 and in August of 2017
- 2015 Result was class A water Very good!
- Benthic monitoring is the study of bugs that naturally live in lakes, streams, and brooks that form the aquatic food chain
- MDEP uses benthic monitoring to determine if the waterbody is in good health or impaired



Annual Stream Clean Up Events

- The stream clean up has been going on for 13 years, since 2005.
- 2,600 volunteers total!(200 on average/year)
- Collected 54 tons of trash picked up! (4.2 tons on average/year)





How did Brewer do it?

- Devoted staff and department heads
- Longevity! Brewer has had many staff members that have been involved for the entire 13 years of the stream clean up.





Public Education, Outreach, and Participation Secrets to Success

- Department heads and mid-management employees work as committee members and team leaders the day of the event
- Involve employees from Public Works, Fire Dept., Police Dept., Parks and Rec, and Environmental Dept. as support staff for the event.
- Keep volunteers coming back each year by sending the thank you letters after each event and then invitation for next event in February of each year.
