

Overview

 Fellowships provide a unique 2-year opportunity for recent graduates to apply their skills and gain experience helping to build sustainability within communities whose way of life and identity face many challenges.

Details

- Immersion in the community connects fellows directly with islanders to gain an intimate understanding of island life and to understand the needs and opportunities around the identified project.
 - Host sites can include municipal offices, schools, and nonprofit organizations within a community
 - Long Island, Chebeague Island, North Haven Island, Vinalhaven Island, Eastport, Deer Isle, Islesboro, Beals Island, and Machias



Why? "To articulate and communicate the shared vision for the future of our town over the next 15 years."

- The community survey results informed our process.
- Open-response questions allowed for thematic coding to develop five guiding principles.
 - Community Spirit, Equitable, Livable, Resilient, Resourceful
- Vision workshops started with information sharing about survey results, then broke into working groups.
 - Working groups developed the framework for the rest of the comprehensive plan.

Products of This Work

- Partnerships with organizations and other towns.
 - Consideration of the GOPIF grant program with the Island Institute as service provider.
 - Collaboration with other municipalities during planning.
 - Information sharing with local organizations like the Friends of Casco Bay and the Casco Bay Islands Alliance.
- Guiding principles to steer the writing of the comprehensive plan.
- The creation of a new Groundwater Quality Committee on the island.
