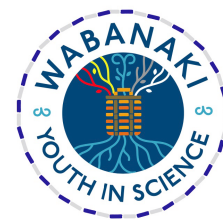

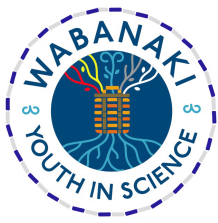

## Preferred Skills & General Qualifications:

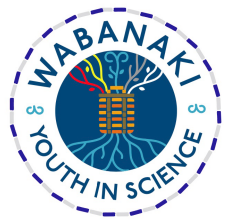
- General camping knowledge – most work weeks will be spent camping near the location of the work site.
- Willingness to learn – this experience will most likely be a huge learning experience for all involved, so it is important you are open to learning individually and as a team.
- Teamwork ethic – you will be working with 5 other crew members, so it is crucial you are able to communicate, be respectful, and adhere to guidance from your crew leader and other professionals who come in to help on projects.
- Professionalism – you will be working with the National Park Service where there will be visitors hiking, paddling, etc. around you while you work; therefore, you should represent yourself, your tribe, WaYS, and NPS in a respectable fashion.
- Safety – trail work will include use of a multitude of tools. For the safety of you and others it is important that you use these tools properly.
- Active – this job will be physically demanding and work days will be long.
- Substance free – the use of drugs or alcohol is not permitted.
