To that end, Naval ROTC provides a venue for you to develop valuable leadership skills while learning to become an officer. The program also provides the opportunity to earn scholarship assistance, in some cases with full tuition and fees, to aid in attaining your undergraduate education in one of UMaine's many competitive majors.

All NROTC students participate in physical fitness training, attend a leadership laboratory, take one naval science class per semester (leading to a minor in Naval Science), and participate in a variety of exciting military training to include: field exercises, leadership reaction courses, basic weapons training, and more. In order to meet the standards within the naval services, we require Marine Corps option students to possess a 1000 on their SAT score, and maintain a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on the UMaine 4.0 scale. Navy option students are required to have a 1200 minimum SAT and maintain the same 2.5 or higher GPA, and are generally required to earn a degree within a STEM program at UMaine.

At UMaine we pride ourselves on our family based team mentality, good order and discipline, our tough realistic training, connectedness, and our legacy of successful graduates who have gone on to military service around the globe.
