### Results from the New Student Survey (2021)

The 2021 New Student Survey results are based on 1,457 new first-year students and 162 transfer students who completed the survey over the summer. These results reflect 65% of the UMaine population of new first-year students and 38% of transfer students in fall 2021. One should remain mindful of this when considering, or communicating, the figures reported below. Further, the number of respondents varies from item to item, which similarly should be kept in mind.

We begin with a presentation of the item-by-item results with first-year and transfer students reported independently (pp. 3-7). For ease of comparison and with space permitting, the two subgroups are presented side by side in each table. Only first-year student responses are presented for the item "As you think about beginning your college experience..." Finally, a separate analysis compares the in-state and out of state students mean scores on the factors used in choosing which college to attend.

But first, we share some things that caught our collective eye (first-year students only):

- UMaine is the first choice for 72% of these respondents.
- For 21% of respondents, the father's educational attainment did not go beyond high school; for the mother's, this is true for 16% of respondents.
- 43% of respondents feel "well prepared" or "very well prepared" for UMaine.
- 50% of these respondents plan to study 10 or fewer hours in the typical week, and 86% expect a first-year GPA of 3.0 or higher.
- Respondents' concerns as they anticipate their experience at UMaine (indicating it as "a concern" or "somewhat of a concern"):
  - Grades (80%)
  - Balancing my time among classes, studying, work, and leisure (79%)
  - Financial -- having enough spending money (73%)
  - Financial -- paying for school (71%)
  - Making sure I get the extra help I need in my classes (69%)

The least of respondents' concerns (indicating it as "not a concern"):

- Drugs and alcohol (83%)
- My personal safety (72%)
- COVID-19 outbreak on campus (71%)
- Transportation (rides to the mall, getting home for break, etc.) (66%)
- Size of classes (64%)
- The five highest-rated factors influencing the decision to attend UMaine (on a scale of 1 to 5):
  - Parent/guardian's rating of UMaine (mean rating: 3.96)
  - Athletic/recreational opportunities (mean rating: 3.95)
  - Teacher's recommendations for UMaine (mean rating: 3.84)
  - Application process (mean rating: 3.84)
  - High school counselor's recommendation for UMaine (mean rating: 3.80)
- The five lowest-rated factors influencing the decision to attend UMaine (again, on a scale of 1 to 5):
  - Undergraduate research opportunities (mean rating: 2.51)
  - Overall value (mean rating: 2.55)
  - Campus atmosphere (mean rating: 2.55)
  - Study abroad program (mean rating: 2.63)
  - Total cost (mean rating: 3.12)
- The six schools that interested respondents most (other than UMaine), to which they had applied and had been accepted:
  - University of New Hampshire
  - University of Vermont
  - University of Southern Maine
  - Husson University
  - University of Rhode Island
  - University of New England

Regarding the two tables above, bear in mind that the ranked mean ratings in the first column are each based on a scale of 1 to 5. Consequently, while it is true that, say, Total cost appears at the bottom of this table, the corresponding means (3.12 for first-year students and 3.04 for transfer students) are far from the bottom of the numerical scale on which it is based. In short, this factor is comparatively low to the other factors—not low in an absolute sense. Further, please take into consideration that COVID-19 impacted the format of spring and summer admissions activities: Admitted Student Days, New Student Orientation, and other spring and summer admissions activities were conducted remotely during 2020. This may have an impact on student ratings.

The following two table present the means scores of these same factors by residency and type of admittance. The factors are sorted in descending order by the overall mean for each group. It is interesting to note that regardless of admission type, out of state students rated the factors more positively than in-state students on most factors. The exceptions included campus diversity and high school counselor's recommendation for UMaine for first year students and campus diversity and total cost for transfer students.
