



UMaine - 2,454 as of today (+6% over last year)





President's Commission on Excellence and Equity: UMaine 2025

We must move beyond recovery to ambitious and forward-thinking strategies that position UMaine as the relevant and powerful force it must be in the University of Maine System, our state, and beyond, for leading with inclusion, innovation and creativity at the core.

The UMaine 2025 Commission began its work in March 2021 and met again in April and May to plan, in visionary ways, to better serve our students, our community, and our state as higher education rapidly evolves following the events of 2020. The focus to date has been:

- to advance the momentum from the lessons learned during the COVID-19 pandemic;
- to prioritize and promote racial justice and equity;

UMaine 2025 will continue its work over the summer assessing the existential challenges **climate change** and the need for **civic education** and recommending how they shape and change our future.

Assisted by a team of creative faculty and staff from New Media, Communication & Journalism, Innovative Media, and Intermedia Programs **UMaine 2025** will deliver a **dynamic series of visions** for the university and public higher education in Maine.

The **UMaine 2025 Commission recommendations** will aim to:

- Foster learner success and high impact student experience
- Innovate Maine's land, sea and space grant research university
- Advance partnerships to support Maine's economic & social prosperity
- Build a more diverse, equitable and inclusive institution

Undergraduate Highlights Spring 2021

- 29% of enrolled undergraduate course sections were offered in person at a designated time (similar to fall 2020)
- 47% of undergraduate course sections offered remotely (51% in the fall)
- 63% of degree-seeking undergraduates took at least one course face-to-face in a classroom on campus or participated in independent studies, research courses, and field experiences (compared to fall 2020 at 70%)
- by the end of the spring semester, students were still enrolled in 96% of credits they were enrolled in as of the end of add/drop (same as spring 2020)
- 72% of those who are eligible have registered for the fall 2021 semester (down 2% from last year)
- 74% of first-years have registered for the fall 2021 semester (down 5% from last year)



Graduate Highlights 2020-2021

- Enrollment exceeded 2400 graduate students for the first time in UMaine's history
- Over the past two years, online graduate student enrollment has increased by 150%.
- UMaine Online MBA ranked 54th in the US by <u>Fortune magazine</u>
- For Fall 2021, graduate applications for are running 33% ahead of 2 years ago at the same time (pre-pandemic).
- Expect 67 doctoral degrees and 415 master and specialist degrees to be conferred in the current 2020-21 academic year by the end of August.
- Held six virtual hooding ceremonies to honor 2020 and 2021 graduate degree
 recipients

Research Highlights

- UM Student Symposium largest ever despite the pandemic, with 7% more projects, and largest online reach (>10,000) includes international attendees.
- Launched the UMaine MARINE initiative, built on the foundation of its nationally and internationally recognized marine programs, to provide through innovative transdisciplinary marine research, education, and strategic partnerships, transformative solutions that improve the quality of life and enhance the social and economic wellbeing of the people of Maine and beyond.
- Launched new research units:
 - Institute of Medicine
 - Maine Center for Genomics in the Environment
- Total R&D awards to date (i.e. June 2020 May 2021) increased from 337 awards at \$114.96 M (i.e. June 2019 May 2020) to 388 awards at \$125.02 M, a 15% increase in number of awards and a 9% increase in funding
- President Joan Ferrini-Mundy named UMS Vice Chancellor for Research and Innovation
