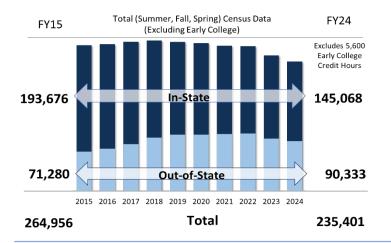
- sustaining the health of our planet and confronting climate change

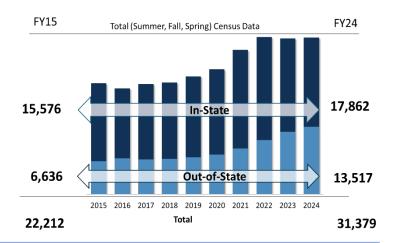

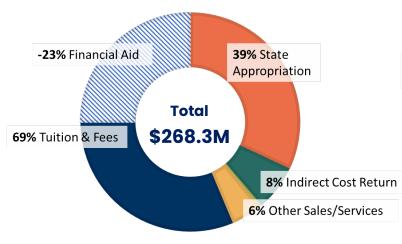
Undergraduate Credit Hours FY15 to FY24



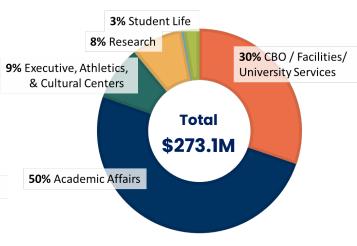
Graduate Credit Hours FY15 to FY24



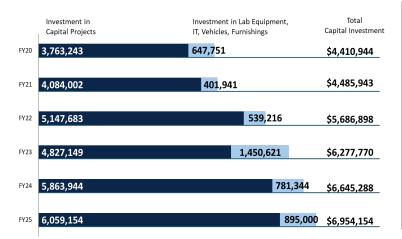
FY25 E&G Projected Revenues by category
