



Current State of Classroom upkeep

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Facilities Management, US:IT, and Academic Affairs continuously monitor the Student Recordscontrolled classrooms and identify the ones in need of major or minor renovations or upgrades. We work year-round to maintain classrooms, but most big projects are tackled over winter break and in the summer.



The Challenges



- The needs on our campus are numerous and widespread, while our human and fiscal resources are finite.
- Managing workflow is difficult.
 For example, emergencies go to the top of the list. Also, FM's and IT's pieces of shared projects have to be sequenced in the right way.

Managing Space at UMaine

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Requests and suggestions are received from Deans, Chairs, Directors, Faculty and Staff

The Space Management Committee meets each semester to review allocation and renovation requests, and share updates.

The Classroom Paint & Polish Committee develops and refines a list of recommended renovations

These two committees share three goals:

- 1) To give faculty the resources they need for teaching and students the resources they need for learning.
- 2) To address the campus's highest-priority needs first.
- 3) To achieve the greatest possible return on investment for each project.

Classroom Renovation Timeline

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October - April

- The Paint and Polish Committee meet from October April to identify the classroom renovation needs.
- FM's and IT's summer classroom renovation lists are finalized in the Spring.
- Stewart Harvey assigns a Project Manager for FM's projects.
- Robin Sherman does the same for IT.
- For projects involving the same classroom, FM and IT collaborate while seeking input— in advance and throughout each project— from faculty who teach in those classrooms as well as their chairs/directors.

May – August / the remainder of the year

- In most cases, summer renovation work begins the Monday after Commencement and continues until Welcome Weekend.
- Work that can be done without disrupting classes is undertaken year-round.



Communicating about Classrooms

- Jeff St. John updates the associate deans on projected summer renovations throughout the winter and spring.
- Stewart Harvey and Robin Sherman update the units that have put requests in to Facilities and/or IT.
- Jeff, Stewart, and/or Robin update Provost Hecker, Vice President Kim, and the deans on major projects.
- Academic Affairs has posted final reports from Facilities and IT on Summer 2016 classroom projects on the Provost's website.
- Faculty Senate is represented on the Space Management Committee and the Paint & Polish Committee by its University Environment Committee co-chairs.



Classrooms of the Future: Funding, Timeline, and Process

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Funding

We are developing a process to invest \$1.2M in UMS Classrooms of the Future funding in Summer 2017 and Summer 2018 classroom renovations. We anticipate:

Timeline

- 1. Working with the college deans to identify potential Summer 2017 renovations in early February.
- 2. Working with faculty, beginning in Spring 2017, on a second set of renovations for Summer 2018.

Process

These projects will involve collaborations between IT and FM, and will include funding for department-controlled classrooms as well as Student Records-controlled rooms.

To prepare for this work, IT and Academic Affairs will be partnering with Faculty Senate on an updated campus-wide assessment of classroom needs over the next 90 days.
