

# Student face covering 101



## Acceptable face coverings



### Cloth face covering

A protection made from textile materials that covers the nose and mouth, allowing for breathing without restrictions with:

- Multiple layers of fabric
- Snug, comfortable fit against the side of the face
- Ties or ear loops
- Ability to be laundered and dried without warping

### Examples of acceptable cloth face coverings:

- Clear face coverings
- Dust face coverings
- Disposable face coverings
- KN95s (non-NIOSH certification)



## Not acceptable face coverings



**N95, N100 or P100 filtering face piece (with exhalation valve)**

Any respirator that has an exhalation valve does not provide source control



**N95 or P100 filtering face piece (without exhalation valve)**

May be used only with special permission and approval



**Half-face and full-face respirator**



**Neck gator or bandana-style covering**

Open at the bottom



**Face shield**

Not acceptable solo; must be worn in combination with a face covering
