

## **Sociology Requirements for the Minor**

The requirements listed on this page are specific to this particular minor. Students are also responsible for meeting any graduation requirements set by their college. Students in the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (CLAS) should make sure to review those requirements as stated on the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences page of the catalog.

The minor consists of SOC 101 and five electives, for a total of 18 credits. At least three of the five electives must be at the 300- or 400- level. SOC 219 (formerly SOC 310) does not count as an elective towards a minor. No courses for the minor can be taken pass / fail.
