TWO PROGRAMS CONNECTING CANADA TO THE CURRICULUM

Overview of Canada in Your Grade's Curriculum

A two to three hour fast paced program covering the curriculum frameworks

This illustrated workshop provides a background for teachers, and presents relevant resources with practical ideas for teaching. It is structured specifically for your grade level curriculum. Each framework is addressed with a briefing and is followed by example resources useful for student work.
