

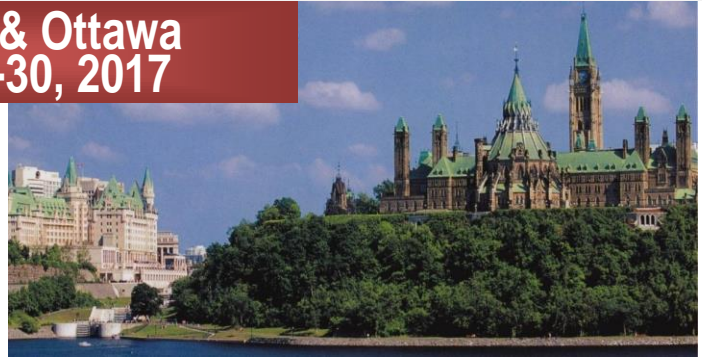

2017 marks the 375th anniversary of the founding of Montréal, and the 150th anniversary of Canada’s Confederation!

Eligibility: Special invitation for teachers, curriculum coordinators, administrators and librarians responsible for social studies (history, geography, civics, and economics) and French. Pre-K to Grade 12 educators who teach at schools in the United States of America preferred. The Canadian and Québec content taught by the Institute’s academic specialists is designed to support educators of comparative cultures; world, U.S., AP history; IB history of the Americas; North American geography; and French language classes.

Description: Québec Dimensions Summer Institute provides foundations in history and geography with contemporary cultural insights through first-hand experiences. Program content is designed to support K-12 professionals seeking to incorporate Canada/Québec content into their classrooms. Program delivered in English. Institute content designed to meet Common Core, C3 and state standards. Select curriculum materials and teaching resources will be provided.

Join us for important 2017 commemorations and for fascinating briefings by academic experts, site visits, and tours in both cities, renowned for multiculturalism. Scholarly experts will present on a variety of topics relating to Québec and Canadian history, geography, politics and culture. The Northeast National Resource Center on Canada has been offering professional development opportunities in Canadian and Québec studies since the 1980s to thousands of American teachers.

Locations: Montréal is one of the world’s largest French speaking cities, and Ottawa is Canada’s bilingual capital.

Registration: USD\$699 includes double-occupancy, some meals, and program transportation. Participants provide own transportation to/from Montréal (arrive by 2 pm on Sunday, 6/25; depart by 2 pm Friday, 6/30), and meals not included in the program. Optional 45 contact hour certificate to be awarded, plus graduate credit for an additional fee. Space is limited. Rolling applications accepted. Application deadline: May 1, 2017.
