French Immersion: L'Institut will be conducted *en français*. The official language of Québec is French.

Program Description: « Québec : D'hier à aujourd'hui » will offer French language professional development in an immersion

setting for six days in Québec, Québec, Canada . Founded in 1608 by Samuel de Champlain and designated as an UNESCO world heritage site, Québec is one of the oldest cities in North America and known for its charm. Program content designed to support Educators seeking to incorporate

Québec/Canadian culture and North American French content into their classrooms. Select curriculum

materials and teaching resources will be provided.

Sessions will address select Québec topics relating to language, culture (literature, poetry, film, music, art, theatre, among others), history, geography, and politics. *L'Institut* will offer a robust learning opportunity through first-hand experiences including:

- expanding vocabulary and strengthening communication skills,
- · scholarly briefings by experts,
- · guided tours and site visits to cultural institutions, plus
- · curriculum planning and discussion.

Program Director: Dr. Frédéric Rondeau, Assistant Professor of French, University of Maine is a Montréal native who

received his Ph.D. from McGill University. His research specialization includes 20th Century Québec Literature and Culture; Francophone Literature of North America; Québec Poetry; and Post-'68 Literature, Culture, and Politics. His research on Québec counterculture was published in February 2016 in a book he

co-edited with Karim Larose La contre-culture au Québec (Les Presses de l'Université de Montréal).
